

FFRC Statement Regarding the Withdrawal of the National Old

Growth Amendment: *January 7, 2025: Washington, DC*: Today, the USDA Forest Service announced they were withdrawing the proposed National Old Growth Amendment, which would have imposed an unworkable set of management restrictions on millions of acres of National Forests. FFRC and others filed comments which demonstrated that the Amendment was legally dubious and ecologically flawed. FFRC Executive Director Bill Imbergamo issued the following statement on the withdrawal:

"Besides distracting the Forest Service from Congress's clear mandate to begin thinning our fire prone forests more aggressively, all this exercise showed was that older forests are widespread on the National Forest System. Most of them are already off limits to timber harvest. Old growth forests are succumbing to fire, insects, and disease, and they need management to make them healthier and more resilient. We look forward to working with the Forest Service to restore the health and productivity of our National Forests."
